



INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATE SPRING MEETING LAUNCH DETAILS

As launch quickly approaches I am very pleased to share and tell you

about the work that has been ongoing these past several months. I am again amazed at what a team we have, not only in the Board of Directors, but the entire TYC team. I am so pleased at the number of volunteers that have been coming to the club week after week to help with our renovation project(s).

The Liaison Committee has met with the Clark Family for a second time to share ideas and keep good lines of communications between everyone involved. The topics discussed included progress on the mainland wall, bridge and Haines sea wall repair. The mainland wall repair has been continuing and has been a high quality job. Clark Marine has opted to install Gabian retaining walls. Gabian retaining walls are basically "wired baskets" that contain large rocks that when filled may be stacked to form a secured retaining wall. Not only is it more attractive than other options it offers great water drainage

and less maintenance requirements. The improvements continue with major reconstruction of the sea wall both on the mainland and in the Haines area as well as great improvement to the bridge infrastructure. The Clark's investment was significant and will go a long way

to securing the grounds for years to come. Future infrastructure repairs are schedule on the island next year and include repair work to the sea wall on the west wall of the island.

TYC also presented Clark Marine with plans for improving the outdoor space around the island. This includes some major improvement and investment to our patio

area. It is in the early design and negotiation phase so more information will be shared when the details have been confirmed. We also discussed some general housekeeping items as well as solidifying some important lease details.

The Board of Governors met and discussed our progress and goals for the next several years. It was an excellent informative meeting and I was able to gain valuable insight and guidance form our past Commodores.

I am looking forward to seeing everyone's reaction to the new and greatly improved clubhouse. This has been a project in the making for nearly two years. Our original designs were started, then tweaked, then finally approved for construction in January this year.

Construction began on February 20th and has officially ended this past week. We still have some clean up to do, but the construction is complete. We have increased the usable club house area by 20%, which was greatly needed.

This job was a huge under taking and went so well because of the enthusiastic involvement of nearly sixty club members. I know when I picked up the phone and called asking for volunteers there was always a willing member who said, "Yes, I'll be there."

There are (literally) too many people to thank for making this happen and I am not sure of the best way to properly acknowledge everyone. So I will say to all of you, thank you on behalf of all the TYC membership. However, I must thank a few of the "team" leaders that organized and executed the master plan. Patience and Cal Tinkey have been the general contractors for this entire project, from design to execution. They have been working non-stop on this project so it would be ready for all of us to enjoy in time for the Spring Meeting. Brian Murray, Gene Haas, Dave Kahl, Ed Kelly, Peter Hubbell, Ernie Pipiles and many others have gone above and beyond for all of our benefit.

We hope to introduce several new members at the Spring Meeting so be sure to welcome them. If you don't recognize someone on the island be sure to welcome them, who knows they may be looking to join the club.

Finally, I would like to thank PC Doug David, PC Dave MacLeod, Rear Commodore Jim Krakowiak for their constant guidance and assistance.




to cross Lake Ontario and enjoy the beauty of our great lake, which we all know has her own charm!

It's really great to finally be talking about Launch Day. A lot has been happening at TYC this past winter and we are all looking forward to enjoying the improvements for the 2010 boating

season.

Launch weekend is Friday to Sunday, April 30, May 1 and May 2. As in the past, we will start as close as possible to 4:00 PM on Friday. However, please note that this year will be different than recent years. As there are no boats stored on the Mainland area due to this winter's reconstruction, we will start launching in the parking lot on Friday and moving down the road as far as we can into the evening. If the weather is good, we expect to round the corner at the gas dock before stopping for the evening. Obviously then, we would start at that point on Saturday morning at 7:00AM.

What this all means is that the usual schedule does not apply this year. Please

note the above changes and be present and ready to launch when the crane and crew get to your boat. Everyone with boats stored from the parking lot to just past the gas dock should plan on being present on Friday. Those stored along the northeast wall need to be present early Saturday morning. If you are assigning a proxy, please notify me in writing in advance and provide the proxy with a copy, Delays are costly in crane and operator time and we strive to be as efficient as possible in order to minimize the cost to the Club. We will be ready, we ask that you are also.

As part of your preparation, please remember to have 50 feet of good line attached to your boat at bow and stern to allow the launch crew to maintain safe control as the boat is lifted. Also, properly located lift marks are a big help in the Spring and essential for the Fall haulout. Lift mark stickers will be available at the bulletin board if you need them.

For mast stepping, the boom truck will be used on Sunday starting at 7:00 AM at slip I-00. As with the launching operation, time is valuable. If you are

going to use the boom truck, have your mast properly prepared and ready to go. The purpose of boom truck crew is to step the mast, not assist with assembly. The Club crew will be manning the gin pole on launch weekend in order to assist members who have signed up for this service. Do-it-yourself stepping will not be permitted until this service is completed. The gin pole crew will start on Saturday at 10:00 AM and again on Sunday, if necessary, at 7:00 ÅM. A sign-up sheet will be posted in the clubhouse for both the boom truck and the gin pole stepping service.

Finally, as you get your own boat prep chores under control, please think about volunteering for one of the Crews –the Launch, Mast Stepping, or Kitchen Crews have time slots available. Sign up for a morning or afternoon. It's a great opportunity to meet and work with other TYC folks – to learn more about boats and the storage/launch process. It's also a great way to complete a few work hours. It can be enjoyable and really not that difficult. Contact me or sign up on the bulletin board when the clubhouse opens.

Some club members have asked why their dues are subject to sales tax.

According to the NYS Department of Taxation and Finance (NYS Sales Tax Law), "dues paid to any social or athletic club in New York State are subject to sales tax if the dues of an active

annual member, exclusive of the initiation fee, are in excess of ten dollars per year. (An active annual member is one who is not a life member, but who enjoys full club privileges.) Where the tax applies to dues, the tax shall be paid by all members, regardless of the amount

> of their dues." New York State Law also states "if a social or athletic club charges an initiation fee, that fee is also subject to sales tax if it is in excess of ten dollars, regardless of whether or not any dues are

charged for membership."

Although missing the mark on budget a bit, we finished the 2009 fiscal year with a slight surplus.

I will be unable to attend the Spring meeting in April due to family vacation, but will have annual financial reports available for all members at the meeting. As indicated in the last issue, 2010 is the beginning of major "infrastructure" projects at TYC: you will see a complete & reconstructed seawall in the Mainland area and at Haines: Electric service has been replaced,

and a new parking lot retaining wall installed (replacing the old concrete & rail barrier). Further, the main water feed line has been replaced and increased in size; The bridge has also been repaired/

reinforced with new sheet piling. All of this year's work is planned to be completed before we launch the boats.

Clark Marine's efforts on these infrastructure projects will benefit TYC for years to come. The job is first class and we are extremely appreciative of their work!

During this month of March, TYC also was visited by the NYS DEC to inspect our gasoline tank and administrative procedures. Several violations were noted, which since have been corrected; The summary of the inspection show we required a new format

> for recording tank readings and reconciling the quantities of fuel delivered, used and stored. Maintaining a fuel system such as ours involves considerable

risk regarding a "spill" potential and subsequent containment & clean-up.

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




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
