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#### Fleet Captain Peter Fleckenstein



WOW, I think that this was the longest and toughest winter in decades. Hopefully the weather will bring us a spring, summer and fall with great sunny days, beautiful nights and fair winds. Perfect weather or not, Tuscarora Yacht Club is going to be an even better place to enjoy the warmer season and the best sailing yet to come this year. With that said, we need to focus our attention on the upcoming spring launch of boats.

This year we are launching boats Friday, May 2 and Saturday, May 3, with the stepping of masts with the boom truck on Sunday, May 4. Michael Algase will once again be heading up the crews. We are going to begin launching boats, starting in the main parking lot on the island, at 4:00 pm Friday evening. Everyone with boats stored in the parking lot needs to plan on being present Friday evening.

Those stored along the west wall driveway need to be present and ready to go Saturday morning promptly at 7:00 am, followed by the north wall and east wall beginning at 7:45 am. Crane time is valuable, and backtracking is very expensive, so either you or a proxy needs to be present when we get to your boat. If you are assigning a proxy, please notify me in writing or email at psfleck3598@roadrunner.com in advance and provide the proxy with a copy of the authorization. Delays are costly in crane and operator time and we strive to be as efficient as possible in order to minimize the cost to TYC, so we expect that you will be ready. As part of your preparation, please remember to have 50 feet of good line attached to your boat at the bow and stern to allow the launch crew to maintain safe control as the boat is lifted. Make sure your boat is clearly marked and the lift marks visible from ground level.

The boom truck will be used Sunday for mast stepping beginning at 7:00 am and starting at slip I-00. Good preparation of your mast prior to lifting it for stepping also saves us expensive time for equipment and operator.

Jeff Strothmann and the club crew will start stepping masts with the gin pole on Saturday, May 3 at 10:00 am and Sunday at 8:00 am. "Doing it yourself" launch weekend is not permitted for insurance reasons, so take this opportunity and make it easy on yourself to get your mast placed with an experienced crew.

I also need to talk about safety during launch weekend. Over the past few years we have had quite an influx of new members with children into the Club. Launch weekend is a working weekend, and with that in mind we need to remind everyone that there will be many potential hazards, such as the front-end loader moving cradles around the club property and parking lots, the lifting of boats into the water with the crane, and the mast stepping operations. The rental of the crane and front-end loader from independent contractors involves various insurance regulations and safety policies by these companies while they are in operation on our property. We will therefore need each parent who brings small children to the club to carefully monitor their children's activities and keep them in close proximity at all times. No children are allowed in or around the operating area of the crane, and they will also need to be out of the roadways and parking lots during cradle movement. Also, absolutely no children are to ride on any piece of equipment during launch weekend. Your attention to this will be greatly appreciated by all. Safety cannot be stressed enough.

Last fall the cradle crews had a challenging time placing cradles because many were not properly labeled. Make a quick check this year to make sure your cradle is clearly marked with the owner's name, boat name, bow & stern. Don't forget your cradle maintenance this year as this is the time to make those repairs and adjustments to your cradle. You may know your own cradle but others don't. You don't want your cradle left up on the hill in the fall because the cradle crew couldn't identify it, so please make sure you label it properly.

I have posted sign-up sheets for the launch, mast, and kitchen crews. Sign-up sheets are available on the bulletin board in the TYC Clubhouse. It is a great way to get your work hours completed early in the year.

In other news, the Board of Directors has increased fees in the following areas for this year. Boom truck will increase to \$60.00 to cover the cost of the boom truck. Gin Pole will have a \$25.00 use fee anytime it is used during the year.

Last, but not least, if you are planning on storing a dingy on the Island or a trailer in the upper yard this summer, the required request forms are on the TYC webpage. Please complete the necessary form(s) and submit them to insure that a spot is reserved for your use.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation and for your help on various work crews. We look forward to an efficient, safe, and fun launch weekend.

In an effort to control our spending and keep Club fees as stable and low as possible, the Board has been discussing a number of procedural changes in the way money is spent and reimbursed. We have updated the Reimbursement Form to keep a more accurate account of which Board member approved the various expenses. We also acquired a set of TYC credit cards; one that will be held by Commodore and the other by Treasurer. These cards are intended to be used to purchase some of the everyday expenses we incur in the operation of the Club, so that members no longer have to spend their own money and later wait to get reimbursed for those expenses. We have established a protocol for the use of the cards that I will go over at the Spring meeting.

As you might imagine, the Director of Operations (Doug Klapper) and his area of responsibility covers everything in the building and grounds and had the lion's share of the Club expenses, which amounted to approximately \$58,800 last year. The Vice-Commodore (Nancy VanVoorhees) had the next largest list of expenses in her direction of the many social events at the Club last year.

Utilities were also a large expense, so I will be looking closely at our suppliers and making sure that we are getting what we pay for. So, please remember not to run water for any longer than necessary and keep A/C running in boats only when aboard. I am also looking to upgrade our phone and internet service to the island in another effort to get better quality for the cost of that service.

I am looking forward to the Spring Meeting where I can discuss these issues with you in further detail and go over the financial reports for the Club.
