

First, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Board for appointing me Director of Harbor Operations. I look forward to working with the new Board and TYC members in the upcoming season. Thanks to the efforts of last year's Board, the Clarks have already removed old wooden and damaged posts at slips along the channel and north walls (I-01 to I-50) and installed several new steel ones. The Clarks will also be looking to either repair, or replace and re-route the main waterline to the clubhouse this spring. Projects on tap for this year are: finish replacing the waterline on the channel wall, replacing I-31 rotted dock, fixing and supporting the electrical and water lines along the south wall of the Island, re-grading & leveling the area along north wall for dock boxes and tables, fill in and level the area along the south wall in Haines, and fill in erosion holes along all perimeter walls. Keep an eye out for future work party postings. As always, it's your help that keeps Tuscarora the nicest club on Ontario's south shore. If you have any dock repairs or other concerns that should be addressed this year please e-mail me so we can attend to your needs.
