


Hallo Wassersportler!



Last year I was asked to help maintain the TYC Website. I was glad to help and so started the newly formed Technology and Information Committee. The TYCWILSON.COM website has undergone some changes last year. The look has not been updated yet, but we have added a new "Members Only" section that contains material that is accessible only to our club members. Right now there are six pages in the Members Only site: "ROSTER", "OFFICER-OF-THE-DAY", "NEW MEMBER LIST", "UPDATE FORM", "SLIP MAP", and "DOCK FORM"...

In addition to some on-line versions of documents you are already familiar with in print, we have added a page dedicated to introducing you to New Members. You will also find two forms you can use to: update your personal Roster information, and for slip-holders, an annual Dock Reservation form to submit electronically.

There are also two new pages added to the "Public" side of the website. One to promote and highlight our TYC Ships Store and the other offers a great view of an electronic Nautical Chart. The "Charts" page navigates you to the Wilson Harbor and our club, but it can display charts from not only anywhere in the Great Lakes, but anywhere in the World!

Right now the site is 80/20, that's 80% "Public" and 20% "Members Only". In the future I foresee those numbers being reversed. While we will always have a side of the site for Public Relations, Promotions and Information dedicated to our visitors, I think the major purpose of the website should be to inform and serve our own members. 
Oh, I almost forgot, with the long and cold winter, I am sure looking forward to spring, our Launch and the 2016 yachting season!!!

!! Launch This Weekend !! Friday-April 29, Saturday-April 30 Sunday May 1

Launch is this weekend!!!! Are you ready??? Again this year, Mike Algase will be leading the Crane Crew and Boom Truck Crew. Jeff Strothmann will lead the Gin Pole Crew and Pete Hubbell will lead the Cradle Crew. Carol Goulah and Jan Klapper will head up the Kitchen Crew. Thank You to all the Crew Leaders!! Sign Up sheets have been posted in the Clubhouse for all the crews. Working on one of these crews is a great way to earn your hours and get to know other members of the club.

We will start launching boats <u>Friday 4/30 at 3:30PM</u> starting with the Power boats just south of the parking lot and moving along to the sailboats in the parking lot and along the road to the Gas Dock **Owners of these boats need to be present starting at 3:30PM**.

Starting Saturday 4/30 promptly at 7:00 AM We will pick up where we ended Friday evening and progress along the North wall and around the island. Hopefully things will move smoothly and all boats should be launched by 2:00PM. Please be certain you are present when the crane gets to your boat. Crane time is valuable and backtracking is very expensive, so either you or your proxy must be present when we get to your boat. If you are assigning a proxy, please notify me in writing or email – tleetcaptain@tycwilson.com – in advance and provide the proxy with a copy for the day of launch. Please may sure you are ready when the crane gets to you. This means checking all thru hulls are closed and you have control lines fore and aft at least 50 feet long.

The Boom Truck will be stepping masts starting Sunday 7:00AM at I-01. Again, delays are costly and frustrating, so Please **Be Ready!**

The Gin Pole Crew will be stepping masts as boats are ready Saturday. Do-it-yourself use of the Gin Pole will not be allowed Launch weekend.

This is the best time to make sure your cradle is maintained. Please make sure your cradle is marked with your name and Bow and Stern. This will make for a much easier job placing cradles in the fall. This is also a great time to mark sling locations on your boat to make sure the slings miss pads when hauling in the fall.

Safety is our primary concern. Launch is a working weekend. Keep in mind there are many hazards around the club associated with the movement of heavy equipment – cranes, front end loader and other vehicles. Children must be vigilantly supervised and out of any area machines are used. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and your help on the various crews. We are looking forward to an efficient, safe and fun launch weekend.

Anyone wishing to store a Dinghy in the parking lot area by the shed must submit a 'Dinghy Reservation' form. This can be found on the website in the links section. We have spots for 12 dinghies, these will be assigned on a first come basis.

Anyone wishing to store a trailer in the upper lot area must submit a 'Trailer Storage Request'. Again, this form can be found on the website. There is a \$75 fee for storing a trailer. The trailer MUST be clearly marked with the owners name and be properly registered.

Your cooperation with these requests is greatly appreciated. In the past few days, a couple of slips have become available. Please check the posting on the Bulletin Board if you desire a change. Looking forward to terrific season on and off the water.

As you may or may not be aware, we are using QuickBooks Online exclusively for all aspects of our accounting, record keeping and bookkeeping. A natural extension of that process has resulted in invoices being distributed electronically. Of course there were some hiccups long the way, but overall it has been an expedient, efficient, and cost-effective method. Please be sure to verify your correct email address in the 2016 roster, along with the rest of your personal contact information. Each of your Board of Directors has established a 2016 budget for his/her office. We have also surveyed the big picture in terms of increases in this season's income and expenses. Given a probable, but minimal, increase in expenditures, there does not seem to be any current need for an increase in either membership dues or dockage. Looking to the future, we must keep in mind that there will

be some significant expenses related to the new docks in the Haines area, the patio extension, the fire pit and eventually an increased lease expense.

A reminder that, if you require reimbursement for TYC-related expenditures you MUST:

- Complete a reimbursement slip that is available on the bulletin board in the clubhouse hallway. Please provide adequate explanation of the expense.
- include an original receipt that identifies the date and store name for each purchase
- get them to me, either in my clubhouse mailbox or sent to my home (address in the roster)

Last year we converted to all dockside purchases (visitor gas, dockage and pumpout) to credit card only so that no cash was filtered through the Stewards' Office. This proved to be a godsend on several levels and, therefore, will continue going forward.

New memberships help to balance club income, and word-of-mouth is still the best means of attracting them. Electronic Reciprocal Letters

LOCCA is in the midst of re-designing the website and the first functionality that will go live in 2016, will be a dedicated section where all the YCs would have their reciprocal policies posted. This will rid YCs of the onerous obligation to send approximately 60 reciprocal letters per year and to receive and summarize 60 inbound reciprocal letters. We estimate that clubs will save approximately \$500 per year in materials and labor to complete this process.

Purpose

The purpose of this YC Reciprocal Privilege is to ensure that this 100 year old tradition remains intact for now and the future of sailing on Lake Ontario. There is a tendency by certain YCs to want to restrict reciprocal privileges and our intention here is encourage YCs to liberalize their policy rather than consider restricting the policy. If this tendency does not reverse then YCs are doomed to disappear if there is no compelling reason for new sailors to join a Yacht Club.
