#### **QR Codes:**

"What the heck is a QR Code?"

The ancient Egyptians are thought to have introduced one of the first types of sailing vessels in 3400BC. But that doesn't mean TYC should retain ancient methods of communication. Imagine how the US Mail would feel about delivering the Tuscarora Currents on stone tablets!

A QR Code might look like hieroglyphics or squiggly squares but it is a great communication tool. It allows your smartphone to "navigate" places effortlessly.

I have posted a number of QR Codes around the club. Some take your phone to different websites, or forms (Like the Green Slips to submit your Work Hours). Another will log you onto the TYC Guest Wi-Fi. One can even be used to pay for parties, like the "Italiano Extravaganza"!

Look for the QR Codes posted at the club. Simply point your smartphone's camera toward the code then click the link that appears.



One I'd like you to try is the "Suggestion Box – QR Code". (to the right) Send me a suggestion, praise or criticize, let us know what you think, and help us steer the ship.

#### **Rising Water:**


We are closely monitoring water levels. Currently our Haine's docks are almost completely submerged. In 2017 we tried to mitigate the water by putting sandbags along the wall in the areas of I-31 through I-51 and tried to use pumps to pump out the road, but it was unsuccessful. At this point we are securing the scaffolding pics that we used in 2017 to allow members to access their boats. (Updates will be sent as needed)

I ask you to please work with your dock mate to do what you can to add planking to your dock to stay above water. Unfortunately, we don't have any control of the lake levels.

### **High Water Update**

Every inch of water added to the surface of Lake Ontario is about 127 billion gallons. I can't even imagine how much that is let alone how long it will take to get 20 times that amount down the St. Lawrence...

As of Saturday, water levels in the lake were only 5 inches below their highest level two years ago.

The International Lake Ontario – St. Lawrence River Board increased outflows at the Moses-Saunders dam near Massena over the weekend to their highest level in more than a month. But Board member Tony David says increasing outflows alone will not lower the lake's water levels.

"Unfortunately, Lake Ontario is going continue to rise until we can get ahead of the supplies that are coming into the basin," David said. That's because there's just too much water coming into from Lake Erie. "Lake Erie is at record high this time. It's never been higher at this time of the year. So that's really eating into the influence that outflows can have controlling or influencing water levels in Lake Ontario," David said.
