FLEET CAPTAIN'S REPORT

THIS IS IT ! THE TIME WE HAVE ALL BEEN WAITING FOR - LAUNCH. Yes Spring is (suppose to be) here and our May 2,3,4 launch weekend is upon us. We will start on the mainland on Friday evening and on the Island at slip I-00 7 AM Saturday morning. From there we will work around the Island clockwise and hope to have all the boats in the water sometime Sunday morning. Following this we will start on boom truck stepped masts with the goal of finishing Sunday evening. Gin pole stepped masts can be raised by individuals Saturday morning and by the crew Saturday after 12 and all day Sunday. YOU OR YOUR DOCUMENTED AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE MUST BE PRESENT OR YOUR BOAT WILL NOT BE LAUCHED NOR YOUR MAST STEPPED.

Ed Kelly will be leading the crane/boom truck crew, Pete Hubble will be leading the cradle crew, Jeff Strothmann will be leading the gin pole crew and providing the energy resources to make it all happen Marsha Emmon will be leading the kitchen crew. Joe Emmons will be our Safety Officer and Jim Krakowiak will be inspecting all cradles to identify those needing work before they can be used in the fall. These folks need your help and cooperation. SIGN UP FOR ONE OF THE CREWS. It is a great way to really get to know fellow club members, have some fun, and get a free meal. All these advantages are over and above the financial advantage of keeping haul + store + launch fees a fraction of other options. This year we are introducing a new opportunity call "Crew Lite" duty. It involves the opportunity to sign up for either a morning crew, an afternoon crew or for the hardy ones - both. This option will also allow you to experience a spilt crew tour with a taste of crane in the morning and a taste of cradles in the afternoon. Give it a try ! You'll like it.

At this writting we have lost 7 docking members, gained 6, have 2 power boat slips open, 6-7 sailboaters on the waiting list and one maybe power boater. The losses appear normal with 3 boats being sold, one move for business reasons, one having bought a larger boat, one having committed before the right slip became available and one for appearant economic reasons. 
DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS REPORT


