COMMODORE'S REPORT

It is with great pleasure that I can finally report that the lease for 2003 has been completed. Last December the Clark family decided that the Brady group would be best suited to be the lessor for the property occupied by the Tuscarora Yacht Club for the past 30 years. Since then the Board of Directors and the Board of Governors authorized Mark Farrell and me to negotiate with the Brady Group to lease the property from the Wilson Boat Yard, Inc. We have been successful and will be operating the club as we have done in the past.

You will see no changes in the operation for the duration of the lease that has just been finalized. That lease is for one year, in a "get to know each other" period Both parties have agreed to begin negotiations for 2004/05 after the boats are in the water this spring.

The new lease will require that the dockage for this year be increased to \$57. per foot. While this is not great news, it is still under the going rate in the harbor and indeed will be under the rate charged at other clubs and marina's in nearby harbors. It should also be noted that the clubs costs in the past few years have gradually increased to the point where the other sources of revenue to the club were beginning to subsidize the cost of dockage. At this point the Board of Directors and the Finance Committee will be reviewing all the sources of revenue to see if other adjustments are appropriate.

I would be remiss if I didn't acknowledge the great assistance provided by Mark Farrell in these negotiations and completion of the final lease agreement. In addition the Board of Directors and the Board of Governors both played a pivotal role by offering advise and consent in this endeavor.

I am grateful too the continued support of the membership and am gratified that you have decided to maintain your relationship with TYC despite the difficult period of time we have been through. You are to be congratulated.

Launch is scheduled for the weekend of May 2,3,4 and weather permitting by that Sunday evening the boats will be in the water and the masts up. This is a week later than last year to permit a little more time for Spring painting etc. We will start on the mainland on Friday evening and on the Island at I-00 on Saturday morning. I have inherited some information on individual slip assignment/slip changes requests. To insure I have the most current information, if you want to make ANY changes in your slip assignment please drop me an email or snail mail note stating your desires and your boat length, width, draft and mast height if appropriate and your seniority date. I will keep a list of these requests by seniority and use it to help guide assignment decisions if and when the occasions arise.

I look forward to seeing you at the Club during our Spring maintenance month and/or at launch.






