The end of winter is near, so let's talk about the New 2022 Boating Season!

Please mark on your calendars:

*** April 29, 30, and May 1 (Friday- Sunday) - Launch weekend.**

We will begin Friday afternoon launching with the Sailboats in the parking lot, then Powerboats south of the parking lot, and after that crane will be moving down the road (west side) as far as we can into the evening. We would start at that point on Saturday at 7:00 AM. We plan to launch boats all day and finish the rest on Sunday (if any are left).

Owners of the boat to be present and ready to launch when the crane and crew get to your boat. Everyone with boats stored from the parking and west side of the island close to the parking lot should plan on being present on Friday. Those stored along the northeast wall need to be present early Saturday morning. If you are assigning a proxy, please notify me in advance and provide the proxy. As part of

your preparation, please remember

to have 50 feet of good line attached to your boat at bow and stern to allow the launch crew to maintain safe control as the boat is lifted. Also, properly located lift marks are a big help.

***April 30, Saturday:** The gin pole crew will start on Saturday when the first boat show-up, and again on Sunday, if necessary, at 7:00 AM.

***May 1, Sunday:** Boom truck mast stepping starting at 7:00 AM at slip I-00.

A sign-up sheet will be posted in the clubhouse for the boom truck and the gin pole stepping service.

Cradles crew will start Saturday and continue on Sunday if needed.

For making all listed above to work, we have to invest our time and effort: sign up for volunteering in one of the crews: Launch, Mast Stepping, Cradle or Kitchen crew. You can complete a few work hours, get to know new people, and gain experience!

More information regarding launch details will follow at the spring meeting. If a slip becomes available at any time during the year, the details of the slip will be posted on the Club's Website, and an Email notification will be sent out to all members. Available slips will be posted on the TYC clubhouse bulletin board between launch and haul out. If a member would like to request a slip or request a slip change - please fill out the Slip Request / Swap Form on our website. Those members wishing to store their dinghies in the parking lot must fill out the online Dinghy Reservation Form on our website. Note, we have 12 spaces available on a first come basis. Members may also store their boat trailers in the upper parking from May 1 through October 1 for an \$81.00 tax included fee. This request must be made by filling out the online Trailer Storage Request on our website. I would like to thank those who submitted their dock reservation contract and proof of insurance certificates. If you have not done so please send them to me ASAP.

These items I've mentioned will require completion before the boats are launched.

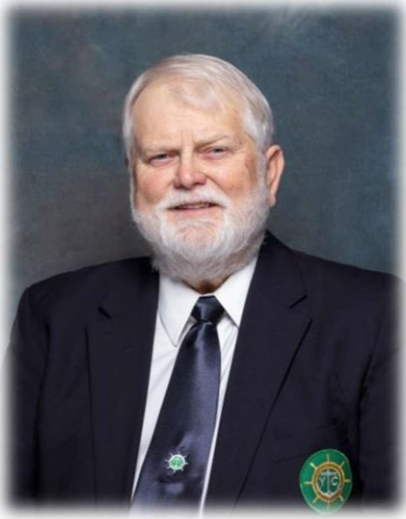

Fire Extinguisher Safety

NEW REGULATIONS - Fire extinguishers must be replaced 12 years after manufacture.

The new fire extinguisher regulations going into effect on **April 20, 2022** may seem a little confusing, but if you know the model year of your boat, they boil down to two simple points.

If you own a boat that is model year 2018 or newer, you may need to replace your fire extinguishers.

- In addition to meeting the carriage requirements for the correct number of extinguishers for the size of your boat, they must be labeled as 5-B, 10-B or 20-B, extinguishers labeled with B-I or B-II only are no longer acceptable.
- Extinguishers must not be more than 12 years old according to the date of manufacture stamped on the bottle
- You only have to get new ones if they are no longer serviceable. Good serviceable conditions are as follows:
 - If the extinguisher has a pressure gauge reading or indicator it must be in the operable range or position
 - The lock pin is firmly in place
 - The discharge nozzle is clean and free of obstruction
 - The extinguisher does not show visible signs of significant corrosion or damage.

If you own a boat that is 2017 model year or older (1953-2017):

- You may keep your extinguishers labeled B-I and B-II as long as they are still serviceable, but
- If there is a date stamped on the bottle, extinguishers must not be more than 12 years old according to that date.

Vessel Length and Fire Extinguisher Type Table:

Goes into effect April 20, 2022

Vessel Length	No Fixed System	With approved Fixed Systems
Less than 26'	1 B-1/5-B/10-B	0
26' to less than 40'	2 B-1/5-B/10-B or 1 B-II/20-B	1 B-1/5-B/10-B
40' to 65'	3 B-1/5-B/10-B or 1 B-II/20-B and 1 B-1/5-B/10-B	2 B-1/5-B/10-B or 1 B-II/20-B
