In January the Board approved our 2004 Launch Schedule for April 30th, May 1st and 2nd. Mainland should be in Friday night so we can start on the Island Saturday morning. The gin pole will be operated Saturday and Sunday for masts and we will have a boom truck for larger masts on Sunday after the boats are in. With this launch date fall haul out will be October 8th, 9th, and 10th with boom truck masts off a week end before. As of December 8th we had 2004 reservations from 127 members accounting for 3732 ft of boats plus request forms from six existing members who had docked elsewhere in 2003. As of mid January we had been able to accommodate all but one requestor and our committed footage was just over 4000 ft. The demand for larger docks continues to outstrip our supply and the supply of smaller docks continues to exceed the demand. The Boat Show chaired by John Gartner is beginning as I write this and between it, the great publicity that surrounds the fun we have in the summer and the capable recruiting of Bill Guggemos and Bob Stone, I believe that we will have more boats this summer than last. This is also due in part to some great planning and execution by Commodore Mark Farrell and Director of Harbor Operations Skip Hagen. In my fall note on the subject of slip space I mentioned that last season 43 boats were shorter than the minimum length for the slip they occupied. We are working hard to keep costs as low as possible particularly in the face of recent lease changes. To do this we need your help. If you are in an oversized slip and you would be willing to have your boat assigned to a smaller slip please let me know. Such a change could not only save you money but it could increase Club income with placement of a larger boat in your current slip.

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
