FIRST AID SUPPLIES

The club has recently upgraded our first aid supplies with a new first aid kit. The kit is stored on the upper shelf behind the Ship's Store display. It is a well stocked first aid kit and was greatly needed. There still is a small kit on the wall near the kitchen entrance for simple things such as ban-aids, etc. Just remember that the more extensive kit is available. Special thanks to Ken Olson and Amy Rainville (No Tomatoes) for taking the time to get this job done.

Well it is almost July and that is when the last of our three lease payments for 2004 is due. Our lease requires us to pay some money up front for club renovations and maintenance each year. As of this date we have spent almost seven thousand dollars out of our pockets on club improvements. Large expenditure jobs performed by our members include the spreading of gravel around the island next to the wall and docks during and after launch weekend, and the installation of new ceiling tiles in the club house the last several weeks. The club members have also performed several less expensive but needed maintenance jobs around the club house and grounds. As of this moment we have spent more than thirty thousand dollars more than last year at this time. The large ticket expenditures include increased lease payments and county and town taxes. Our next lease payment should show a decrease by the amount of money we have spent so far for club improvements.




