fleet captain's report



Launch weekend is April 27, 28, and 29. We will start as close as possible to 4:00 PM on the 27th, then 7:00 AM Saturday and Sunday. As in the past, we will start on the Mainland, and proceed as far onto the island as we can. We have managed to launch as many as 8-10 boats from the parking lot in the past, so anyone in the parking lot should either be there, or have a proxy on site for launch on Friday evening. Please remember to advise the club in writing in advance if you have a proxy assigned, and ensure that person also has a copy. Depending on progress Friday evening, anyone on the west side of the island could be in line for launch early Saturday Morning. Crane time is valuable, and backtracking very expensive, so either you or a proxy needs to be present when we get to your boat. Also remember to have control lines a minimum of 50 feet long at both ends of the boat. As we lift your boat and

place it in the water, please consider verifying the lift points. Keep the digital camera handy, and snap a few shots. I will make "LIFT" stickers available again this spring. A few seconds in the spring

can save us hours of crane time in the fall when the boats land on straps!

The boom truck will be used Sunday for mast stepping. Good preparation of your mast prior to lifting it for stepping also saves us expensive time for equipment and an operator. The Gin Pole will be used by club crews during launch weekend. Saturday will start at 10:00 AM, and Sunday at 7:00 AM, with Jeff

treasurer's report



PROPOSED BY LAW CHANGE - PLEASE REVIEW FOR

TYC By-Laws Addenda #3 Proposed revision:

The Board of Directors proposes the following revision to Addenda # 3 of the TYC By-Laws. This revision provides additional detail as to the process for notification of the member that his/her account is in arrears, and that their membership is in jeopardy.

The board has been reluctant in the past to post a members name without first notifying them of the possibility their arrears status will be made public. Under the revised by-law the member will be notified by the club prior to his/her name being posted to the bulletin board or newsletter, and have an opportunity to resolve the issue. This proposed language is a by-law that the Board of Directors feels is more readily enforceable, and offers more latitude to the member before corrective actions are undertaken.

Current language:

- 3. All moneys due the Club are payable upon presentation of a bill, and the following actions shall be taken by the Board:
- A. At the end of thirty (30) days the member is in arrears his or her name will be posted on the Club bulletin board and or newsletter (electronic or otherwise).
- B. All voting rights as a member are suspended and a member cannot run for office or hold any Club office during this period.
- C. At the end of forty- five (45) days from, an arrears member shall be sent a Postal Service Delivery Confirmation letter stating that his or her membership will be terminated if all moneys are not paid in ten (10) days and he or she will forfeit all initiation fees.
- D. Under extenuating circumstances, by two-thirds (2/3) vote the Board may modify the above terms.

Proposed Language:

- 3. All moneys due the Club are payable upon presentation of a bill. At the end of thirty (30) days the member is in arrears. Once in arrears, all voting rights as a member are suspended and a member cannot run for office or hold any Club office until they return to members in good standing. Upon any member going into arrears, the following actions shall be taken by the Board:
- A. The member will be contacted by an officer of the Board of directors for a courtesy call to discuss payment.
- B. If not settled within 1 week of contact by the Board of Directors or at the end of forty five (45) days from initial billing, whichever is longer, his or her name will be posted on the Club bulletin board and or newsletter (electronic or otherwise).
- C. At the end of sixty (60) days from initial billing, an arrears member will be sent a Postal Service Delivery Confirmation letter stating that his or her membership will be terminated if all moneys are not paid in ten (10) days and he or she will forfeit all initiation fees.
- D. Under extenuating circumstances, by two-thirds (2/3) vote the Board may modify the above terms.
